## Hazardous Material Information Requirements

When you contact Linea Peninsular to ship hazardous materials, we will need the following information:

- I** – Identification Number UN (or) NA (if applicable)
- S** – Shipping Name (remember to add the technical name if the commodity is NOS)
- H** – Hazard Class(es)
- P** – Packing group (if applicable)

This gives us the information necessary to determine if Linea Peninsular can carry your hazmat shipment. Our knowledgeable Customer Service representatives can answer your questions. When you are ready to make a booking, please provide the following additional information on every hazardous commodity.

- **Gross Weight (IMO requires net weight in KG also)**
- **Package Type** (skids, pallets, bottles or cases are not authorized packaging descriptions)
- **Piece Count (we need to know exactly what you have – i.e. (4 fiberboard boxes containing 20 x 2L bottles each)**
- **Reportable Quantity** (YES or NO answer)
- **Emergency Response name and telephone number** (This can not be an 800 type number!)
- **EMS Code** – Emergency Response for Ships
- 

Depending on the type of commodity, the following additional information may be required to meet international regulations.

- **Limited Quantity** – YES or NO
- **Marine Pollutant** – YES or NO
- **Poison/Toxic Inhalation Hazard** – Zone A, B, C or D
- **Flash Point** (in Celsius or Fahrenheit) – Applicable only if one of the hazard classes of the material is a flammable liquid or combustible liquid
- **Control Temperature** (in Celsius) Applicable only to certain class 4.1 or 5.2 material
- **Residue** – YES or NO
- **Competent Authority Approval Number** – if applicable to your shipment

## Documentation Information

The following information is required for shipping hazardous/dangerous cargo per IMDG Amendment 30 2000.

- *Signed Container Packing Certificate Statement, Signed Dangerous Goods Declaration Certification*

These two documents, which may be combined in one, are required and mandatory on all Hazardous export loads. The IMO must be scanned or faxed to us prior to delivery to the Port. The proper shipping papers must accompany the container at all times and must be tendered to the port of loading at time of arrival. ISO tank containers containing hazardous materials are exempt from Container Packing Certificate requirements. Dangerous Goods Declaration Certification is still mandatory.

- *It is required that an MSDS travel with the cargo at all times and be presented to the Terminal/Carrier*

When preparing your **IMO Dangerous Goods Declaration**, Please list info in the order above **ISHP** going across the page, i.e. (The first 5 columns in the IMDG book is the order The info should be in on the IMO (Dangerous Goods Declaration Form)).

**NOTE: Providing complete information/documents will prevent unnecessary delays in the process.**

## Placards

**In order to comply with DOT/IMO labeling requirements, containers loaded with hazardous cargo (except in limited quantity) must:**

- Bear the proper placard – One on each side of the container (four placards). The placard shall be firmly affixed at least 4' above the container bottom rails, clean enough to be legible, right side up and with the wording horizontal.
- Entering or leaving the port, all containers which are carrying hazardous materials need to have properly placed placards that correctly describe the material within the container. The container's placards must also agree with the accompanying documentation.

**\*\*\* LIMITED QUANTITIES: If a container only has limited quantities according to IMDG guidelines, there must be a limited quantities placard/sticker on all 4 sides of the container.**

**NOTE: Compatibility of hazardous cargo is the responsibility of the shipper. Call the United States Coast Guard Hazardous Materials Information hotline for standards and compatibility at 1-800-467-4922.**
